

### **Foundation Trustees**

The ASPRS Foundation, Inc. is headed by a Board of Trustees. Dr. Clifford W. Greve is currently serving as President; **Michael Renslow** is the Vice President: **Dr. Thomas** Lillesand is the Secretary, and James Plasker is the Treasurer. Other Trustees currently serving are Roger Crystal; Dr. George Lee, and Dr. Alan Stevens. All current Trustees are past presidents of ASPRS with the exception of James Plasker and George Lee. **Jesse Winch** currently serves as Interim Executive Director and exofficio member of the Foundation Board. The Foundation may add Trustees up to a maximum of nine. All Trustees are appointed by the ASPRS President. The Trustees are responsible for the investment, management, and approval of grants of Foundation funds. Trustees do not receive any salary or other compensation for their services.

### **Financial Status**

When the Foundation returned to ASPRS in 2004, the total aggregate endowed funding for all ASPRS awards and scholarships was approximately \$60,000. Since then, through member campaigns, establishment of new awards, increased funding for region-level awards, and significant contributions through bequests and corporate donations, the total funding has grown significantly and quickly. The Foundation endowed funds balance as of early 2015 was approximately \$1,440,000, including funding to maintain four regional awards. The Foundation Board of Trustees analyzes the total funding level required to fully endow all national awards and scholarships on a continuous schedule, with the goal of periodically increasing those awards to, at least, reflect inflation. In 2014, the Trustees increased the minimum national ASPRS award and/or scholarship level to \$2,000, with the largest awards increased to \$6,500, consistent with the respective deeds of awards and the total level of funds contributed.

### Who Can Contribute?

Contributions are invited from individuals, ASPRS Regions, businesses, and organizations that see value in supporting the ASPRS Awards and Scholarships Program and the goals and programs of the Foundation. The Foundation is able to receive direct contributions in cash, equities and/or other investment vehicles or as endowments, bequests, trusts, covenants, gifts, or legacies. Donors may choose to make either a Restricted or an Unrestricted (General) contribution. Donors will receive a signed receipt once their contribution is received. The Foundation Trustees will review large or unique proposed donations and review any terms specified by the donor to



ensure that the donation will legitimately and substantially enhance the charitable programs of The Foundation and that any conditions associated with the donation can be met.

# **Administrative Expenses**

The ASPRS Foundation has one of the lowest administrative cost rates when compared with similar charitable organizations. For 2014, total overhead costs, including investment costs, were less than 1.5% of the total endowed funds. The Board of Trustees continuously seeks to maintain or reduce those expenses, with the result that more than 98% of donated funds currently go directly to the various ASPRS awards and scholarships supported by the Foundation.

# **Tax Exempt Status**

The ASPRS Foundation is a charitable organization exempt from taxation under the US Code 501(c) 3. Donations to the Foundation are deductible as charitable contributions for federal income tax purposes to the extent provided by law. No goods or services are provided in consideration for contributions.

The Foundation in 2010 awarded the final funds for a \$50,000 grant in support of the Geospatial Revolution documentary, a Public Broadcasting System film project designed to increase public awareness of geospatial technologies.
